TOTAL \$102,732,000



Congestion Mitigation: \$8 million

Projects intended to reduce congestion and improve traffic flow in University City, Steele Creek and South Charlotte areas.

Northeast Corridor Infrastructure (NECI): \$20.3 million

A collection of projects selected to improve pedestrian, bicyclist and motorist access to the CATS Blue Line Extension. These investments also make connections to other community assets like the Cross Charlotte Trail, Mecklenburg County greenway system, UNC Charlotte, NoDa and the Applied Innovation Corridor.

Bryant Farms Road: \$18 million

Extend Bryant Farms Road from Elm Lane to Rea Road to provide a critical east/west connection in the Ballantyne area.

Sidewalks and Pedestrian Safety: \$17 million

Construct new sidewalks, connect sidewalk gaps, and install pedestrian crossings and signals.

Bicycle Facilities: \$6 million

Expand the bicycle network in Charlotte and strengthening sidewalk and bikeway connections in the Independence Boulevard corridor.

Idlewild Road/Monroe Road: \$12.8 million

New turn lanes, updated signal timing, buffered bicycle lanes and a new multi-use path, as well as a streetscape project to create a pedestrian-oriented and mixed-use development corridor along Monroe Road from North Wendover Road to Easton Road. Improvements include wider sidewalks, planting strips, accessibility ramps, enhanced bus stop locations and improved neighborhood accessibility.

Pavement Repair, Traffic Control, Transportation Safety and Bridges: \$20.6 million

- Resurface streets
- Upgrade traffic signal system
- Upgrade traffic control devices
- Repair and replace bridges
- Construct ADA improvements

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

TOTAL \$50,000,000



Funding for the Charlotte Housing Trust Fund, leveraging private investment dollars, to provide affordable and well-maintained housing for low- and moderate-income individuals and families in the Charlotte area.

- Multi-family new construction and rehabilitation
- Homeownership development in targeted neighborhoods
- Housing for seniors, disabled and homeless populations
- Acquisition of properties for developing mixed-income communities

NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENTS

TOTAL \$44,500,000



Funding for capital projects to address immediate infrastructure needs in our city's established neighborhoods and emerging high-growth areas.

- Support **Corridors of Opportunity** (\$14.5 million) and invest in the six corridors: Beatties Ford/Rozzelles Ferry, Central/Albemarle, Freedom/Wilkinson, I-85/West Sugar Creek, North Tryon/Graham and West Boulevard.
 - > Intersection enhancements, sidewalks and safety improvements
- Support the **Comprehensive Neighborhood Improvement Program (CNIP)** (\$30 million) and invest in five neighborhoods: Central/Albemarle/Shamrock, Prosperity Village, Sunset/Beatties Ford, West Trade/Rozzelles Ferry and Whitehall/Aysley.
 - > Link neighborhoods with employment centers, parks, transit and schools
 - > Connect streets, sidewalks, trails and bike lanes to enhance existing community assets and provide more mobility/transportation options

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
