City of Charlotte Bond Referenda on November 3 Ballot:

\$102.7 million for streets:

Fund street and intersection projects, upgrades to traffic control system, improved Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) infrastructure, measures to improve pedestrian safety, and repairs and construction of bridges, sidewalks and bikeways.

\$50 million for housing:

Increase the supply of quality and well-maintained affordable housing for low- and moderate-income households through new construction and preserving existing housing.

\$44.5 million for neighborhoods:

Improve infrastructure such as sidewalks, streetscape, curbs and gutters, storm drains, landscaping and pedestrian lighting in the city's established neighborhoods and emerging high-growth areas.

STREETS

Proiects include:

- **Congestion Mitigation** to improve traffic flow in University City, Steele Creek and South Charlotte areas.
- Northeast Corridor Infrastructure projects to improve pedestrian, bicyclist and motorist access to CATS Blue Line, greenways, UNC Charlotte, NoDa and the Applied Innovation Corridor.
- Bryan Farms Road extension from Elm Lane to Rea Road.
- Sidewalks and Pedestrian Safety measures including building new sidewalks, connecting sidewalk gaps and installing pedestrian crossings/signals.
- Bicycle Facilities to strengthen sidewalk and bikeway connections in the Independence Boulevard corridor.
- Idlewild Road/Monroe Road intersection improvements including new turn lanes, updated signal timing, buffered bike lanes, as well as a streetscape project along Monroe Road from North Wendover Road to Easton Road adding wider sidewalks, accessibility ramps and enhanced bus stop locations.
- Various other projects and programs to repair and replace bridges, construct ADA improvements, resurface streets, upgrade traffic signal system and control devices, etc.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Funding for the Charlotte Housing Trust Fund to **provide affordable and well-maintained housing** for low- to moderate-income individuals and families in the Charlotte area.

- · Multi-family new construction and rehabilitation
- Homeownership development in targeted neighborhoods
- Housing for seniors, disabled and homeless populations
- Acquisition of properties for developing mixed-income communities

NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENTS

- Support the Corridors of Opportunity and invest in the six corridors by improvement infrastructure: Beatties Ford/Rozzelles Ferry, Central/Albemarle, Freedom/ Wilkinson, I-85/West Sugar Creek, North Tryon/Graham and West Boulevard.
- Support the Comprehensive Neighborhood Improvement Program and invest in five neighborhoods: Central/Albemarle/Shamrock, Prosperity Village, SouthPark, Sunset/Beatties Ford, West Trade/Rozzelles Ferry and Whitehall/Ayrsely.
